PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to the 2016 President's report for Sydney South Hockey Association. 2016 has been a year of consolidating all the great work commenced by the Board and helpers last year in difficult circumstances. As a Board we have had our ups and downs but working together we have been able to move forward in a number of operational areas that have consumed much in the way of time and effort. The Board will continue to move forward with a number of initiatives, including optimising the use of the Greenhills Hockey Centre.

After a long time coming I take great pleasure in being able to advise you that work has commenced to construct the actual turf pitches at Greenhills. After a tumultuous 5 years of promises, false starts and delays Team Sports (who are part of the Polytan group) have started work on building a much needed all weather hockey facility for all players and spectators in Sydney South.

The association has been represented by the Greenhills Working Party which is comprised of Teresa Clews, Lyn Smith and Carol Harriss. They have toiled for many years to get Sydney South a hockey facility which will be the envy of other associations. We are now working on a realistic and more importantly achievable timetable with delivery of the two fields and associated amenities building by the end of March 2017.

This will mean we will be farewelling Jenola which has been the home of our association in its many incarnations for a significant number of years. I should recognise all the work that Lyn Smith our Director Facilities has put in with some willing helpers to keep Jenola fields playable through some terrible wet weather in the past few years. Our move to Greenhills will certainly bring a sigh of relief for our Director Competitions Janice Tully. Our increased capacity to host hockey in different formats and in all sorts of weather will make life much more enjoyable for Janice I'm sure. Janice has strived to deliver competitions for not only our youngest players but right up to high school girl age and is now involved with the development of our indoor competitions.

Through the diligent work of Scott Tully our Director Finance, our association is in a strong financial position. This allows us scope to increase our activities especially with the two new fields. There have been many curved balls thrown at Scott particularly in regards to representative hockey fees and he has worked through those as quickly as possible with positive results.

It would be remiss of me to not acknowledge the amount of hard work put into the representative program for Sydney South Hockey Association. Our retired Director Representatives Justine Maroney put her heart and soul into the successful representative program we offer. Our program has seen success on the state field hockey championships arena much to the surprise of some of the more fancied association teams as well as HNSW. Not only have we been complimented on our skills and enthusiasm, but our conduct as good sports on the field has also been recognised. This is as much recognition of the players as it is of their mentors.

Game development has been an ongoing interest for Matt Rowling our Director Game Development. Matt is the conduit between our association and the HNSW Regional Coaching Coordinator (RCC). Matt has continued dialogue with the RCC on behalf of the association and our clubs where they have requested assistance with coaching from the RCC. The association has sought assistance with coaching accreditation programs and well as assistance with umpiring. Our association has continued a strong program to accredit young umpires and affording them

opportunities to officiate at various state championships where they have acquitted themselves to the highest standard.

Our Director Marketing Mitch Rowling has sought and obtained various sources of sponsorship for Sydney South. Mitch has been working with others to ensure we have a presence on social media as well so that our association can get up to date information out to our members as quickly as possible. Whilst we still have a way to go, our financial future through corporate sponsorship is on the way up – we now will have more sponsorship potential with Greenhills coming on line.

I would like to thank our association Secretary Carol Harriss. Carol continues to work away in the background keeping the association running. Carol has extensive years of experience behind her – more than she cares to remember. Carol has assisted me in the execution of my duties as President over the past two years and has been my sounding board and advisor particularly in recent times. I thank her for her support as I do all the current Board Directors.

Finally I would like to wish the incoming Board the best for the future. The association now moves into a new phase of its business and I implore those of you that sit on the sidelines to offer your assistance to the Board to assist in any way you can.

DIRECTOR'S REPORTS

COMPETITIONS

For the 2016 season the Sydney South Hockey Association again only ran a junior competition. The competition was run in four full field grades, with two sub junior development programs.

We had teams in the competition from Bosco Hockey Club, Cronulla RSL Hockey Club, Sharks Hockey Club, Sydney Girls High School, Sutherland District Hockey Club and Tartans Hockey Club.

The junior first and second grade competitions are open to all under 18 female players. They are aimed at high school players. As our top level local competitions all these games were played on synthetic fields. Due to limited availability at Sylvania, the competition was run on Friday evenings at Moorebank and Sunday mornings at Sylvania. The finals and grand finals were held at Sylvania. Both competitions were extremely competitive and both grand final games went beyond golden goal extra time, into penalty shoot outs. Sharks took out second grade, with Tartans winning first grade.

FACILITIES

Jenola was once more the home ground for the local Association competitions. Condition of the fields varied throughout the year. Early in the season grass length was a problem, when cut mounds of grass clippings littered the field requiring volunteers to rake clippings off the fields so play could occur. Following complaints to Council, mowing of the grass was managed better and playing conditions greatly improved.

A working bee was held on March 5th to mark the fields, thanks to Ron Smith and Eddie Jones for volunteering on the day. Thanks also to Laurie Daley and Allen Kavanagh who made time during the next week to ensure the canteen and amenities block was spick and span for the start of the season.

Bosco again ran the canteen at Jenola with the Tartans Club running the BBQ. Thanks to all who kept the players and spectators well fed and the amenities clean and tidy.

Unfortunately the Greenhills Hockey Facility project incurred further delays, with developers again unable to source enough suitable fill. Work on the site was put on hold in February and not recommenced until June. The Commonwealth Bank loan expired at the end of April and the Association will need to reapply once construction at the site is well underway.

PolyTan/Team Sports, the company building the hockey fields, gained access to the site in September and is working towards completion in March 2017. Council has endorsed building of the amenities block with a completion date to coincide with that of the fields.

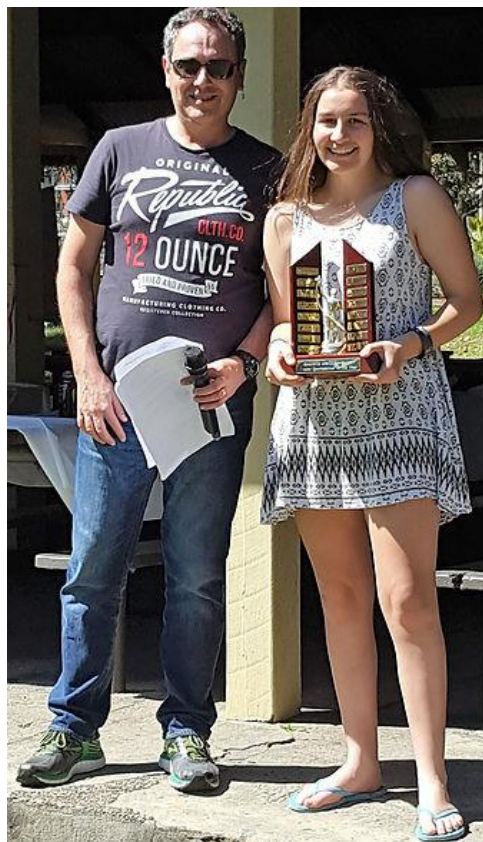
